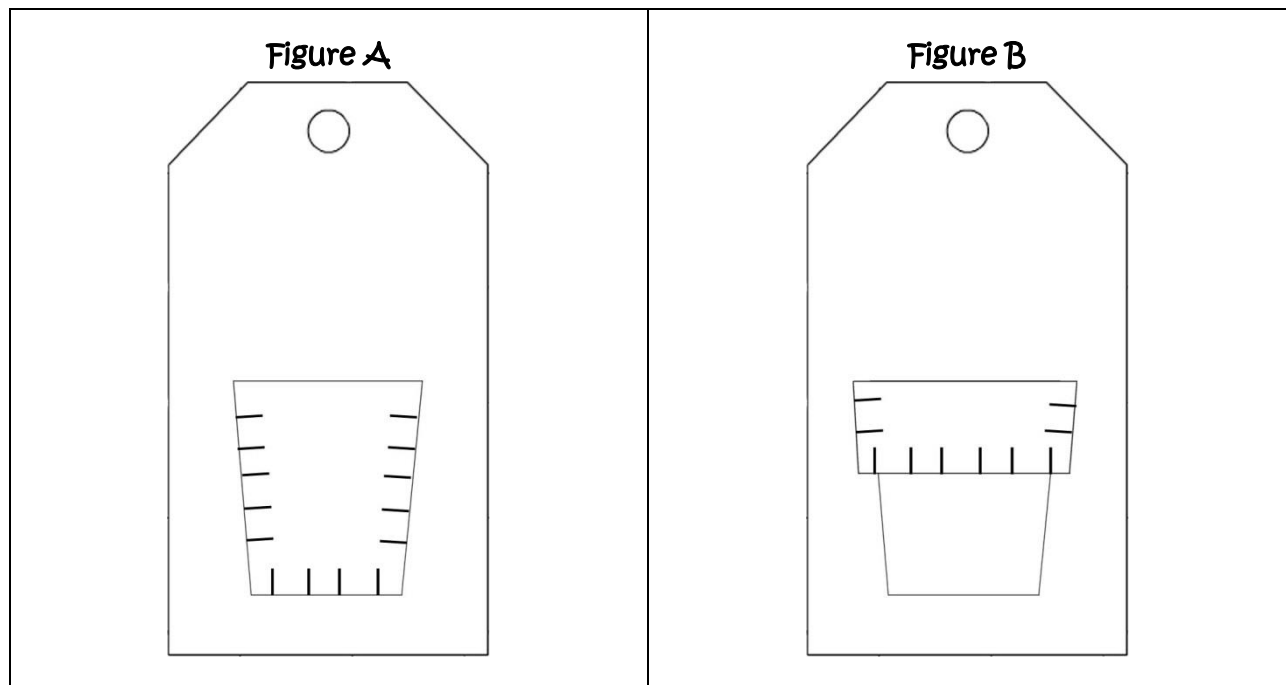
Materials:

- Pre-washed National NonWovens WoolFelt*
 - Beach Sand 10" x 11" piece
 - Canyon Ridge 5" x 6" piece
 - 3" x 4" pieces of the following colors: Rustic Crimson, Pink Grapefruit, Straw, Reet's Relish, Moss, Grassy Meadows
- DMC Six-Strand Embroidery Floss: (use three strands at a time)*
 - 3857 (for flower pots)
 - 3012 (for green leaves)
 - 355 (for pink and red leaves)
 - 738 (for straw leaves and gift tags)
 - 3829 (for buttons)
- Nine 1/4:" yellow/gold buttons
- Scissors, freezer paper, pen, large-eyed crewel/embroidery needle

* Use any colors you wish for this project; it's a great way to use up scraps!

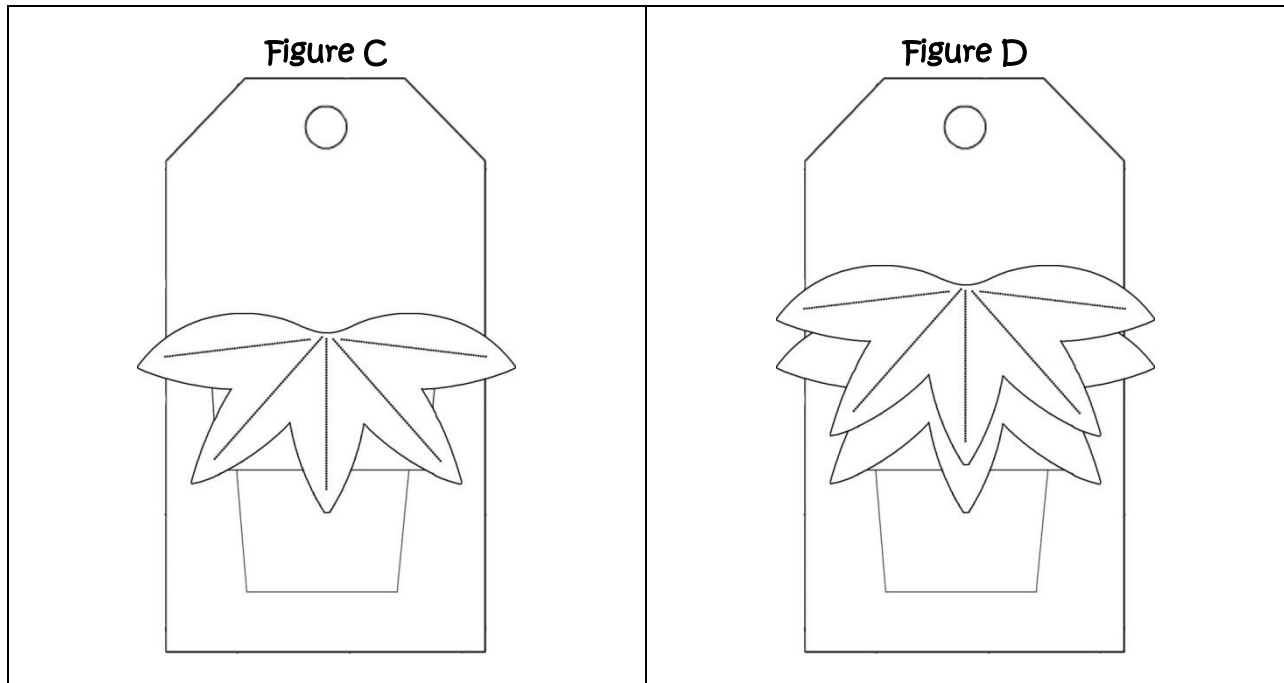
Instructions:

- Trace all pattern pieces onto freezer paper and cut out.
- To use the freezer paper templates, place them shiny side down on the fabric. Set the iron to the wool setting with no steam; the iron must be dry. Iron the freezer paper onto the fabric, pressing down for a few seconds until the freezer paper sticks.
- Cut the pattern pieces out in the following quantities:
 - Six gift tags (cut out the small circle in the gift tag)
 - Three flower pot bottoms and tops
 - Three poinsettias from the green WoolFelts
 - Three poinsettias from the red/pink/straw WoolFelts
- Pin the flower pot bottoms $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the edge of one of the gift tags. Using the 3857 floss, sew down with a blanket stitch on the sides and bottoms only. (See Figure A.)
- Pin a flower pot top on each flower pot bottom, lining up at the top as shown in Figure B. Using the same floss, sew down with a blanket stitch on the sides and bottoms only.

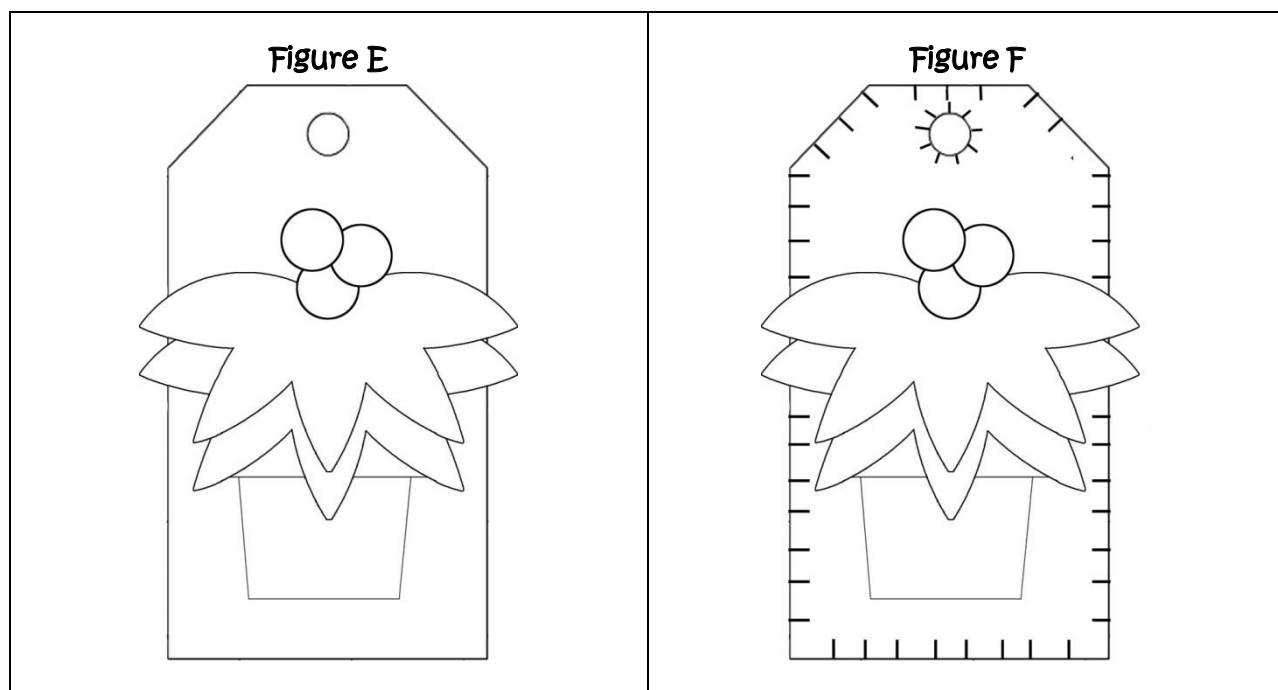


- Repeat for the other two gift tags.
- Pin one of the green poinsettia leaves on each flower pot. Using the 3012 floss, stitch down the center of each section using a backstitch. (See Figure C.)

- Pin one of the red/pink/straw leaves on each green one. Using the 355 floss (for the red/pink leaves) or the 738 floss (for the straw leaves), stitch down the center of each section using a backstitch. (See Figure D.)



- Using the 3829 floss, sew three buttons at the top of each poinsettia, covering where the stitching meets. (See Figure E.)
- Layer one of the remaining gift tags behind an appliqued one and pin together. Using the 738 floss, blanket stitch around the small inner circle. Then, blanket stitch around the entire gift tag, sewing underneath the overhanging leaf points. (See figure F.)



- Repeat for the two other gift tags.
- Each finished gift tag ornament measures 5" tall, and approximately 3 ¼" wide.
