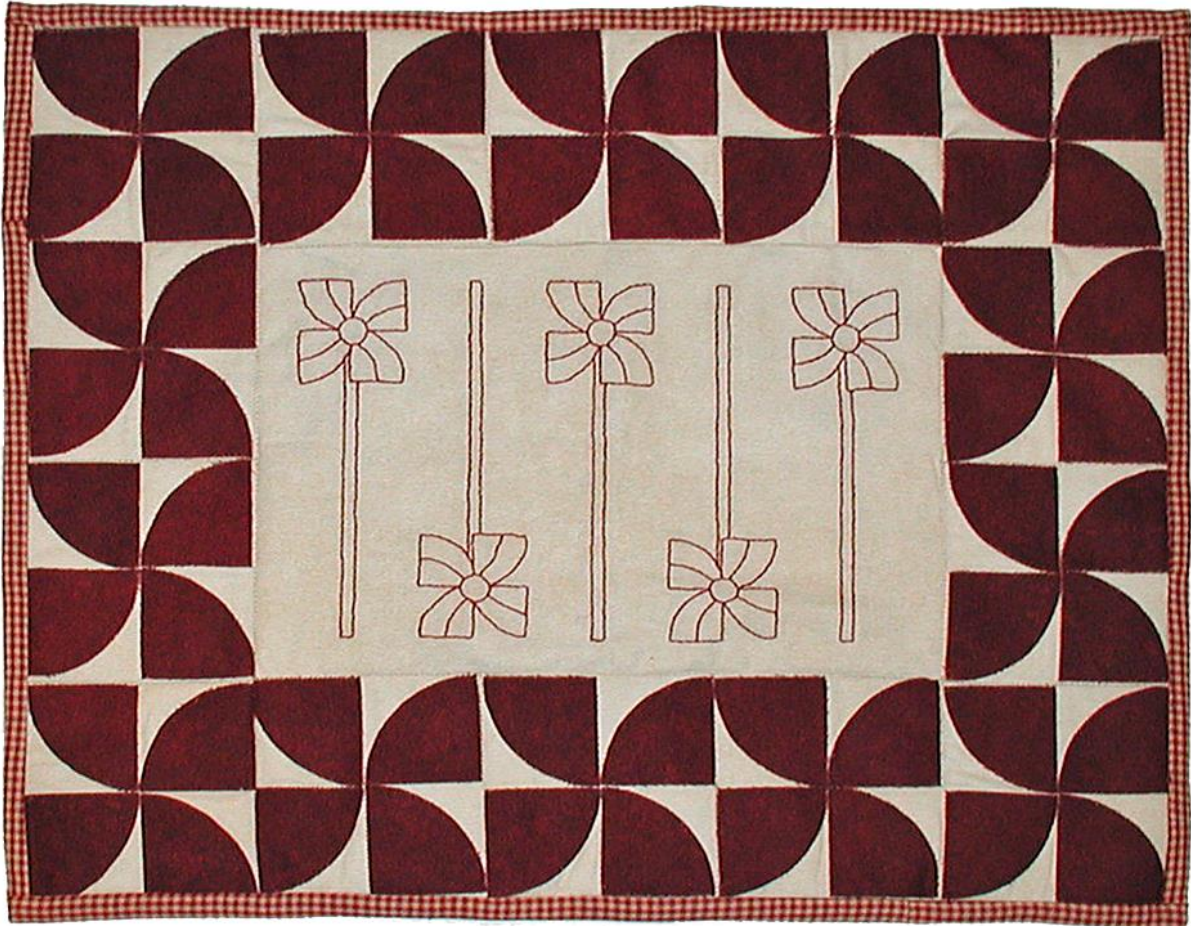


Pinwheel Redwork Mini Quilt

Cotton Home Décor Project - Finished size is approximately 20.5" x 16.5"

Fabric Requirements:

- 1/2 yard cream fabric for blocks and redwork panel
- 20" x 15" piece red fabric for pinwheels
- 24" x 20" piece red fabric for backing
- Batting
- 86" binding fabric of your choice

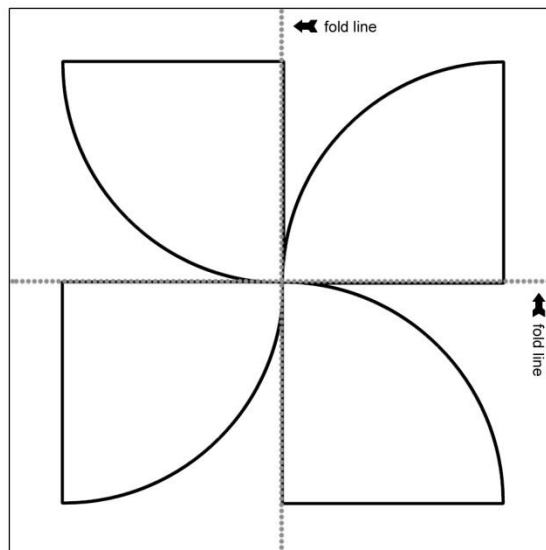
Other Materials:

- Basic sewing supplies and sewing machine
- Red embroidery floss and thread to match fabrics
- Embroidery Hoop
- Sewable fusible web
- Red Pigma Micron Pen and light box/window

Instructions:

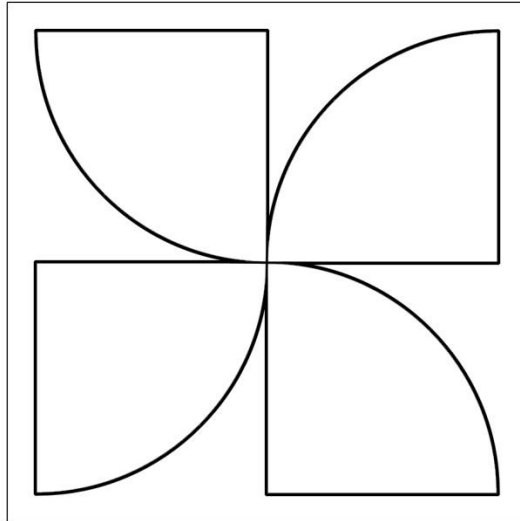
- For the redwork:
 - Cut a piece of the cream fabric large measuring 20" x 16" for the redwork.
 - Print the redwork design out at 100%:

 - Transfer the redwork design onto fabric using the Red Pigma Micron Pen and a light box/window, or your preferred transfer method.
 - Stitch with a back stitch and your choice of red embroidery floss.
 - When complete, press and trim redwork panel to 12.5" x 8.5".
- For the pinwheel blocks:
 - Cut twelve 5" squares from the cream fabric.
 - Apply fusible web to the 20" x 15" piece of red fabric following manufacturer's instructions. Cut out twelve 4" circles.
 - Cut each circle into quarters.
 - Fold a 5" cream block in half and press. Open, and fold in the opposite direction and press.
 - Fuse four circle quarters onto the block as shown in Figure A.
 - Machine applique the pinwheels onto the blocks.

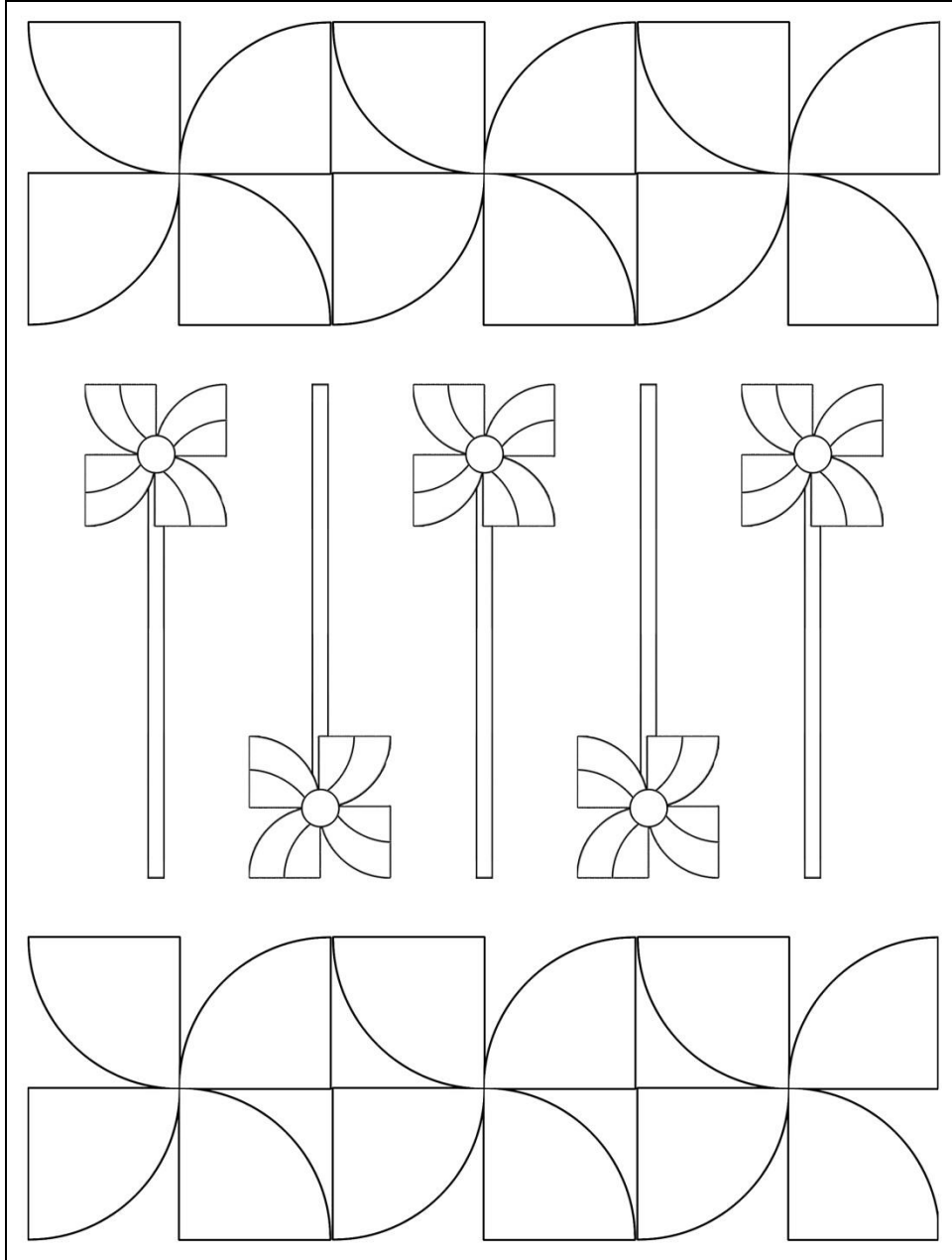
- Trim the block to 4.5" x 4.5", as shown in Figure B, and then repeat for the other eleven blocks.

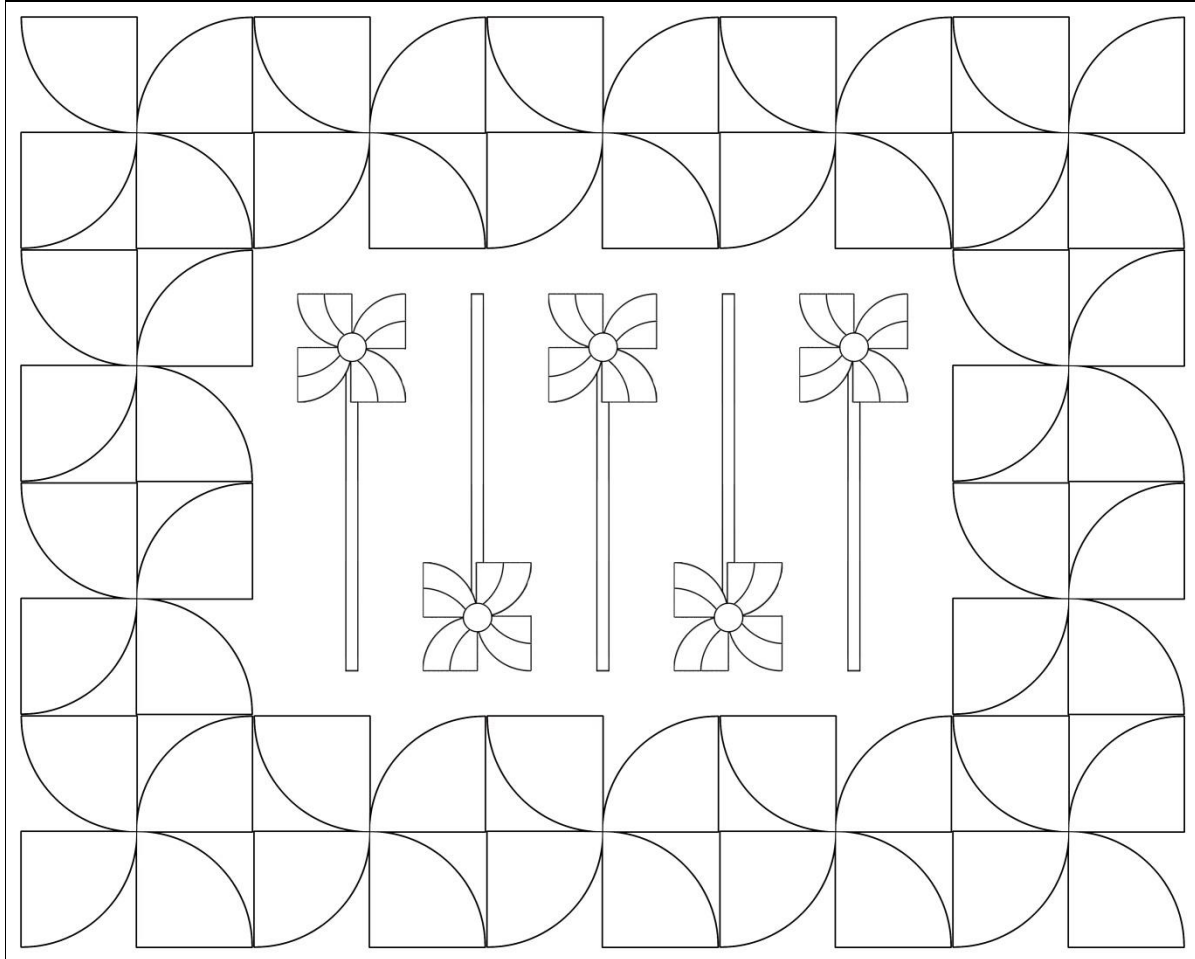
- Assemble the quilt:
 - With a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, join three pinwheel blocks. Repeat.
 - Join the pinwheel rows to the top and bottom of the redwork panel as shown in Figure C.

- With a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, join four pinwheel blocks. Repeat.
- Join the pinwheel rows to the sides of the redwork panel as shown in Figure D.

- Layer the quilt top, batting and backing fabric together and quilt as desired. Trim.
- Prepare the binding and attach to the front of the quilt with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam.
- Fold binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch. Press quilt.
